# Message from Headteacher

I am so proud that our school continues to go from strength to strength – we have so much to celebrate and this week we have added something else!

This week we were notified that we have attained the Silver Arts Mark award. This national award is testament to the array of activities pupils in our school engage with. Thank you to Mrs Elston and Mrs Stirk who have led our work towards the award, to the staff and to the external agencies who have supported us In being able to offer so much for our pupils within the school curriculum and beyond.

We are now finalising our submission for the Learning Outside the Classroom award. I will keep you posted on this!

To give you a flavour of some other things to celebrate:

Our school results at the end of Year 6 were above local and national averages in the last academic year.

### Message from Headteacher (continued)

Our Year 4 pupils scored significantly above the national average in the Multiplication Check and our school's results were in the highest 20% of schools nationally.

Attainment of Year 6 pupils in the Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling test was also significantly above the national average and placed us in the highest 20% nationally.

The Little Wandle system for phonics has been successfully implemented this year and we are seeing tremendous progress in early reading. Last year, our phonics results were above local and national (School 81% attaining expected standard compared to local average (76%) and national average (75%) and we hope to maintain this trend this year.

Our results for children meeting the expected standard at the end of Reception year was above local and national averages despite Reception pupils missing significant early learning due to the pandemic.

Our children's English and Mathematics books are regularly used by external Literacy and Numeracy professionals as exemplars to support the development of teaching and learning in other schools.

We have sustained the exceptional after school club offer with children accessing clubs relating to sports, arts, drama, dance, ICT, modern foreign languages, yoga, mindfulness, zentangle and more! The fact that so many of these clubs are absolutely free for families and run due to the commitment and enthusiasm of our school staff is definitely something which marks our school out as very special.

Our rates of school attendance are consistently above national averages week on week. In the autumn term we received an award for being in the top 25% of schools nationally.

Our pupils' voices in school are strong and we consult and listen to children's ideas at every opportunity. Our Pupil Forums, including the House of Hoole, the Punctuality & Attendance Crew (PAC), Junior Safety Officers, Global Ambassadors, Sports Leaders and Ethos Ambassadors work alongside staff, governors and other agencies to continue to improve and develop our school. We also continue to lead the local cluster schools Pupil Council.

The workshops and events we have run this year have been very well received and we continue to extend the ways in which we support families to work with us.

Our systems for safeguarding and pastoral care have been commended by the Cheshire West & Chester Safeguarding Children in Education Team and by an external safeguarding consultant who we invited in to review our systems and processes.

Governance continues to be a strength of our school with governors actively engaged in the life of our school. Governors completed the Shaping Governance programme in the Autumn term and were commended on their knowledge of and involvement in the strategic leadership of the school.

We have enjoyed so much sporting success this year. Our trophy cabinet has had several new shiny trophies and medals added as a result of outstanding performances in netball, cross-country and football. Children of all abilities have had the opportunity to engage in an array of new and exciting sports including gold, wheelchair sports, curling and boccia.

#### HETTY

I am pleased to report that the HETTY nursery was re-inspected by Ofsted last week. The report is due to be out very soon and the headlines will be shared with you as soon as possible. I am pleased that the quality of care and support for pupils in the care of HETTY has been acknowledged in the latest report which I am sure will be a pleasant read.

#### **Bluecoat Trustees Meeting**

On Friday 19th May, our school hosted a meeting of the Bluecoat Trustees. The Bluecoat Trustees are the governing group of the charitable foundation which set up our school many years ago. During these meetings, the headteacher is asked to provide a report to the trustees about the progress of the school. As I always say, our children always do such a great job of of talking to and thanking visitors to our school!

I am so proud of the panel of children who were asked, with very little notice, to meet with the trustees to talk about events and activities which encourage children's lights to shine in our school. Families will be aware that we strive for our children to become responsible, tolerant citizens and confident thinkers. I feel that being asked to stand up and speak to adults without preparation shows real character and courage.

Thank you so much to Leon, Mahfuz, Monty and Rosie who blew the socks off the Trustees with their confident and articulate accounts of life in our school.

All are welcome to join us on the night - please just let the School Office know so we can plan the seating for the audience.




# Secret Storyteller Strikes Again!
