### Message from Headteacher

#### School Reports

School reports were issued this week. It was a pleasure to read about children's achievements and how they have shone very brightly over the year. I hope that you enjoyed reading your child's report and celebrating it with them.

Thank you to children and families who have returned the report evaluation sheets. This is a sheet at the back of the report where there are boxes for a parent/carer comment and a child's comment.

If you have not yet done so, please send these back to school via the office. If you would like another copy of the evaluation sheet to complete, please speak to staff in the office. Comments we receive via these forms are shared with staff. They also help us when we are considering new developments in school.

#### School Badge

Just to reassure all families – there will be no sudden change to the school badge. There are no plans to suddenly introduce the new school badge over the next school year.

In September, we will begin to engage children in the process of designing the new badge. Over the year, we will finalise the design. The new badge will be phased in over time, starting from September 2024.

There will be no requirement for parents/carers to immediately buy uniform with the new badge on. The new badge will be phased in as a gradual process as children outgrow jumpers and cardigans.

We will work with Parent Governors to find solutions to ensure that families are not disadvantaged in any way as a result of this change.

### **Sports Days**

The second week of Sports Fortnight started with a visit from Mrs Renondeau who held an assembly about her sporting success. She talked about the importance of perseverance and hard work to achieve your goals. Mrs Renondeau represented Team GB in the European 50 km running race in Spain last year. Team GB finished first! The children were really interested to hear her inspiration story and were fascinated to see her GB kit and medal.

Richard Jones from Wirral Taekwondo visited us again this week and worked with Year 1 and Year 3. The children learnt some of the patterns and skills needed for this sport. Mr Jones really enjoyed working with all of the children and I know they all thoroughly enjoyed the sessions.



On Wednesday, we welcomed Mr and Mrs Disch into school who talked to the Year 5 children about Volleyball. Both Mr and Mrs Disch play the sport at a high level so we were really keen to hear about it. Mr Disch also talked about his time officiating during the 2012 London Olympics-the children found this really interesting and had many questions. The children had the opportunity to take part in a practical session where they were able to try some of the key skills.

On Thursday morning, the Reception children worked with their buddies and took part in multi skills activities where they practised their basic skills including balancing, throwing and running. All the children had a fantastic time and it was lovely to see the older children working with the Reception children. Some children have also had the chance to learn some new sports including curling and archery.

This week, Year 6, Year 4 and Year 3 had their sports days which were a chance for all the children to take part in field events and races. It was wonderful to see everyone involved in the activities. Sadly, the rain prevented our Reception Sports' Day however this has been rescheduled for Wednesday, 19th July at 9.30am.

Over the last few weeks, Year 3 and Year 6 have been fortunate to have some cricket coaching from England Cricket. They have learnt many of the basic skills needed for cricket and it has been great to see the progress made. We hope to invite these coaches in again next year.

#### **Crochet Club Success**






Our Year 6 Crochet Club have worked so hard over the year to produce some absolutely outstanding cross-stitch pictures.




## **Hoola Hooping For Charity**

Ruhaani is an amazing artist and brought in all these works of art to show us!


