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
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## Message from Headteacher

### Holidays during term-time

I am concerned about the number of requests for time off for holidays during term-time. I appreciate that the cost of holidays significantly increases through the school holidays but I would urge families to avoid taking children out of school.

Please be assured that I take absolutely no pleasure in having to inform families that fines for missed school apply. Fines for holidays or school irregular attendance are payable directly to Cheshire West and Chester Council.

However you will appreciate that we are bound by national and local policy on applying fines where holidays are taken. We belong to a cluster of local schools and share an agreed policy on absence during term-time and when fines apply. This shared local policy is formulated in line with guidance issued by the Department for Education.

**Fines are £60 per each parent, per each child, which rises to £120 each if you do not pay within 21 days.**

Over this term, children in many year groups will sit national tests. In addition, we begin the process of supporting children's transition to the next year group and new teachers. Please, wherever possible, avoid taking your child out of school during term-time.




