Message from Headteacher

The day began with a question and answer session where the children were amazed to hear about Tom and Joe's rise to success, from being signed for Sale Sharks to their experiences of playing for England. We were also lucky enough to meet Georgia, also from Sale Sharks, who represented the USA rugby team at the World Cup. The children were intrigued to find out what Tom and Joe had to do in order to make it as a professional athlete. Tom said, "If you want to achieve something, you can make it happen through dedication, perseverance and focus. Believe in yourself and it will happen."

All the children got the opportunity to play some games in the wheelchairs and the smiles on their faces showed what a fantastic time they had.

Santa Dash





The Year 1-4 free clubs are incredibly popular and fill up quickly. We want to ensure that all children have the opportunity to attend a club if they haven't registered before.
