Smart Phone Free Campaign



It was wonderful to welcome a group of parents into school on Thursday morning to discuss how we can support our children with having a smartphone. We discussed the Smartphone Free Childhood website (smartphonefreechildhood.co.uk) which is a grassroots movement bringing parents together to stand up for healthier, happier childhoods and to encourage them to spend more time away from screens.

Technology is going to be part of our children's lives and we need to support them to use it safely. Did you know that on our school website, there are many useful documents including an e-safety checklist which can guide you to keeping your child safe online? During our discussion, we shared that it is possible to set restrictions on internet routers, tablets and phones which prevent children from accessing inappropriate content as well as restricting the time that they spend on their devices.

It was reassuring to hear from other parents that we are all having the same conversations with our children about social media. Children often believe that they are "the only one" who hasn't got a smartphone or "the only one" who does not have social media. After our parents discussing this together, we know that this is not the case.


