Collective Worship

In our commitment to develop children's critical literacy skills, we have teamed up with Picture News to help develop their understanding and appreciation of the news. Having age-appropriate conversations with your child about the news keeps them interested and informed about what's happening in the world. They move from wanting to know what happens in MY world to what is happening in THE world and their place in it. By having regular conversations about the news, you are able to share a whole range of topics and together make more sense of different events, issues and stories.

Every two weeks, class based collective worship will focus on a current affairs topic, helping inform the children in an age appropriate way and will link to our Christian values and a Bible story.

This week, children learnt about the Prime Minister's announcement that he intends to build 370,000 new houses every year. They discussed what is important to consider when building new homes. In considering protected characteristics, children discussed that local areas should include something for everyone.

Children then explored the Bible story Jesus told of the houses built on sand and on rock. Children were reminded that if we build our lives on a firm foundation, such as faith and our school values, we will be stronger in the storms of life.

Questions you may want to ask your child:
What sort of buildings do you like?
What buildings should we have more of near us?
Is there anything else we need in the local area?
What do you like in our area and what would you like to change?

Cheshire Phoenix Season Ticket


We have been very kindly gifted a school season ticket for Cheshire Phoenix Basketball matches.
